**Purpose** 

This policy ensures that all employees, subcontractors, and visitors use appropriate **Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)** to minimize workplace hazards and comply with the **Personal Protective Equipment at Work Regulations 2022** and the **Health and Safety at Work Act 1974**.

## Scope

This policy applies to all individuals working on or visiting **TDR** sites where PPE is required for health and safety purposes.

## Responsibilities

### **Management Responsibilities**

- Conduct risk assessments to determine required PPE.
- Provide PPE free of charge to employees where necessary.
- Ensure all PPE meets legal safety standards (CE marked where applicable).
- Train workers on the correct use, maintenance, and storage of PPE.
- Monitor PPE compliance and replace equipment when necessary.

#### **Employee and Subcontractor Responsibilities**

- Wear required PPE at all times when on-site.
- Inspect PPE before use and report any defects.
- Maintain PPE in good condition and store it properly.
- Inform management if PPE needs replacing or is unsuitable for the task.
- Follow all health and safety guidelines regarding PPE usage.

### **Required PPE**

PPE requirements vary by task and work environment. The following PPE must be worn as specified:

### **General PPE Requirements**

- Safety Helmets: Mandatory on all active work sites to protect against head injuries.
- High-Visibility Clothing: Required to ensure visibility, especially in low-light conditions.
- Safety Boots: Steel/composite toe-cap boots must be worn to protect feet from heavy objects and punctures.

### Task-Specific PPE

- Harnesses: Required when working at height, including scaffolding and roofing activities.
- Dives: Must be worn when handling sharp materials, chemicals, or during manual work.
- Eye Protection: Safety goggles or face shields must be used when working with power tools, chemicals, or debris.
- Hearing Protection: Ear defenders or plugs must be used in high-noise areas.
- **Respiratory Protection**: Face masks or respirators must be used when exposed to dust, fumes, or hazardous substances.

## Non-Compliance

Failure to wear PPE correctly may result in disciplinary action, removal from the site, or further consequences as per company policy.
